- Registered Training Organisation and Learn Local




EDUCATION, TRAINING AND EMPLOYMENT

Employers engagement

- Engagement with local employers to find out what job vacancies are present now and the future.
- What are their needs?
- What employment skills does a new employee require?
- Is there a strategy to employ youth? Yes
- Make an agreement with employer for students to bypass normal recruitment process
- Organise short term job trials

Accredited and Pre accredited courses:

- English, language and literacy
- Preparation for employment and job readiness
- Vocational tasters : hospitality, customer service, cleaning, retail, aged
 care



Education, Employment and Training

Workplace Inclusion Program

- Partners with employers to provide employment opportunities for people who struggle to secure work via mainstream recruitment processes
- Includes pre-employment and work readiness training
- Provides mentoring and support for participants
- Provides ongoing support to the employer and participant once placed in work



Purpose

Workplace Inclusion Program

- Meets the recruitment needs of employers
- Involvement in enhancing and changing the lives of unemployed and their families
- Succession planning
- Workforce diversity
- Alternative recruitment practice
