

Community Education and Australian Apprenticeships
















Community Education and Apprenticeships

- 2.1% of apprentices study at community education providers
- 7.5% of community education students are doing an apprenticeship
- 17.3% doing a Certificate I or II








Community Education and Apprenticeships

- 14.3% with schooling below year 10
- 5.9% in technical and trades apprenticeships
- Compared with 83% at TAFEs ,37% at private RTOs, and 36% at schools






