

#### Adapting VET in Creative Ways



- Adapting accredited and non-accredited VET courses so they can be better applied, in ways that are relevant to building the RAR skills (Resilience, Adaptability & Renewal)
- Choose units relevant to the Lived Experience of your participants, not just "off the shelf" VET courses
- Tailor teaching & learning to suit local conditions (which may be in crisis thru natural disasters), and give the learners leading roles in running the hands-on, creative activities

- Leasing the MakerSpace "on spec" to have a go at running practical, hands-on, creative programs for all ages & stages, and listen to whoever turns up
- Finding partners within Local Council, other NGOs, Health, Education & Businesses to try new things
- Seeking Board-level liaison with other colleges, special assistance high schools etc
